Joshua 1:9

9 I hereby command you: Be strong and courageous; do not be frightened or dismayed, for the Lord your God is with you wherever you go.'

When God gave this commandment to the Jews, they had just lost Moses. He had just died, and the troubled nation had lost their leader and shepherd. It's easy to imagine that the people were concerned about the future, worried about what might be coming next, even frightened. So much had changed in their lives!

Change is hard. Many times (most of the time?) it calls us out of a place that seems safe and comfortable and calls us to a new place that is unknown. Often humans will choose to stay in a place that is known, even if it is not the best place for us, just because change can be scary. We feel better about that which is known and may be scary, verses anything new and unknown, even if it might be what is best for us. Even if that's what God wants for us.
