

Psalm 19:1 (CEB)

Heaven is declaring God's glory;

the sky is proclaiming his handiwork.

Where have you seen God today? As many of you know we recently took a few days and visited Taiwan with our family. Our son-in-law, Kent is from Taiwan, and he wanted to show us around his homeland. It was beautiful. An island about the physical size of Illinois but with twice the population.

We saw cities that were super crowded with one lane streets, and yet, people still managed it without any of the road rage we hear about in the U.S. We saw incredible mountains, and we snorkeled a couple of times in the beautiful South China Sea. Everywhere we went, we could not help but see God's incredible creation. We witnessed such powerful beauty!

But even though we were in this exotic location, we also witnessed God's creation in very normal ways.
